- Chickens live on average 8 years but can live up to 15 years
- Some hens lay up to 300 eggs per year
- The heaviest egg ever recorded was 12 ounces
- Egg shell color is determined by breed
- A freshly laid egg is 105 degrees Fahrenheit
- To make a dozen eggs, a chicken needs four pounds of feed
- If a chicken has brown ear lobes it will lay brown eggs, white lobes white eggs
- Chickens can fly but will only do so for a few seconds
- A group of chickens is known as a flock
- Chickens are very social and actually play
- Chickens see and dream in color
- Chickens lose feathers in stressed
- A chickens heart can beat up to 300 times per minute
- Chickens have great memories and will remember people
- Baby chickens are chicks. Female chickens are pullets until lay can lay eggs
- Hens are chickens that can lay eggs. Adult males are known as roosters
- The largest breed of chicken is the Brahma, in India one weighed 16.5 lbs
